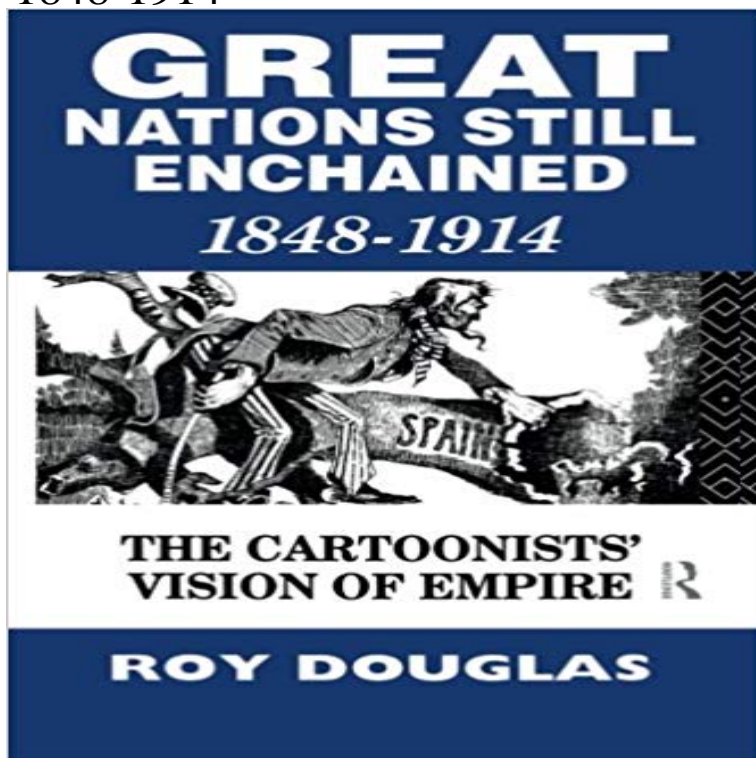


# Great Nations Still Enchained: The Cartoonists Vision of Empire 1848-1914
