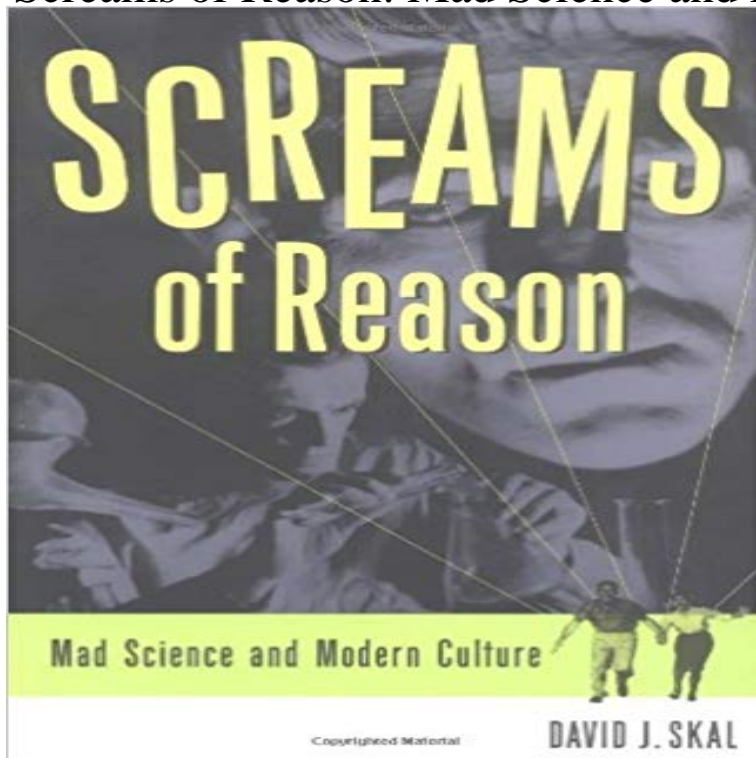


Screams of Reason: Mad Science and Modern Culture
