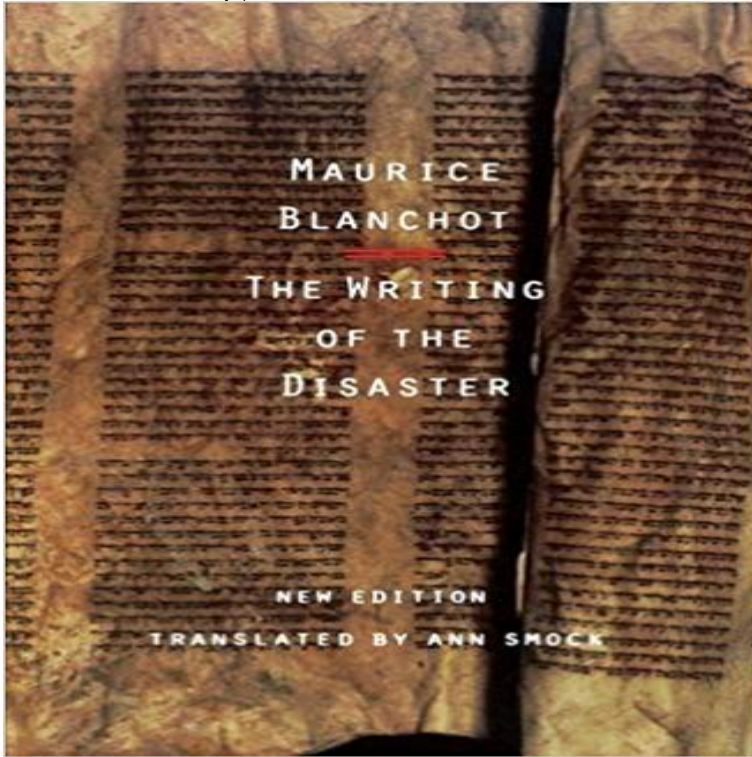


The Writing of the Disaster
